

State Chair Candidates:

Yolanda Bejarano, State Chair: Yolanda Bejarano is a lifelong Arizonan and the proud daughter of Mexican immigrants. Raised in the small farming town of Roll near Yuma, she attended public schools. Her father was a farmworker, and her mother was a homemaker. Before entering politics, Yolanda served as a union steward at a call center for the Communications Workers of America (CWA) for 18 years, later becoming CWA's National Field Director. She now serves as the Chairwoman of the Arizona Democratic Party (ADP), where she has elevated the Party to new heights.

Under Yolanda's leadership, the ADP has achieved financial stability, solidified Arizona's status as a critical battleground state, and built a robust field operation engaging voters statewide, from Yuma to Navajo County. Recognizing the value of a strong Party to support Democratic candidates, Yolanda spearheaded key investments, including \$275,000 in the Arizona Democratic Legislative Campaign Committee (ADLCC) and securing a \$600,000 matching contribution—the largest ADP investment in the ADLCC to date. She also directed \$250,000 to county-level candidates such as the Maricopa and Yuma Recorders, along with \$300,000 for voter mobilization and infrastructure in county parties. These investments, the most significant in recent years, were made possible through Yolanda's aggressive fundraising efforts, which secured a 6:1 cash-on-hand advantage over the Arizona GOP at the height of the 2024 election cycle.

As a rural Arizonan, Yolanda deeply understands the impact of policy decisions on marginalized communities and the importance of campaigning statewide. This year, the ADP built its most robust coordinated campaign in recent history, employing over 250 staffers from across the country, opening 19 offices, hosting town halls in all 15 counties, knocking on 5 million doors, and engaging thousands of volunteers.

Looking ahead, Yolanda is focused on building upon this success to expand the Party's coalition and ensure victories in 2026 and 2028. As Chair, she is committed to holding Trump and the MAGA movement accountable for policies that harm Arizona's working families, registering new voters, reminding Arizonans which Party works for them, and continuing to fundraise aggressively to support Democratic candidates.

A graduate of Idaho State University with a Bachelor's in Journalism, Robert is a proud member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity Inc., upholding its mission of leadership and service. Above all, he values his roles as a father and grandfather, with his family inspiring his professional and community efforts.

I am running for Chair of the Arizona Democratic Party because I believe it's time to turn Arizona fully blue. Cathy Ransom, State Chair: My platform is simple: 1) Provide messaging, 2) Develop a statewide strategy and 3) Communicate better with our community. In 2022, I ran for LD1 State Representative as a Clean Elections candidate. My experience is deep and wide and I'd like to use it to leap-frog the Arizona Democratic Party to a new level of professionalism, respect and competence.

What do Democrats stand for? How do we communicate that message? There is work to be done. Let's do it together!

Dave Braun, State Chair: Dear fellow Democrat:

My name is Dave Braun. I'm an attorney in Phoenix, and a long-time state committeeman. I also served our state for twelve years as Justice Court Judge in Maricopa County. I am a candidate for the Arizona state party chair at the state Democratic convention on January 18, 2025.

Well, we got whipped!! Election Day 2024 was a truly rotten day in Arizona Democratic politics.

We lost Arizona by about 5.5% to Trump, the single largest defeat in any of the seven swing states, and we lost an additional three seats in the State Legislature.

I plan to make sure that the Arizona Democratic Party is on every internet site, every political TV show, every podcast, every live event where we bring our compelling message to the voters of Arizona.

How will we do this? WITH YOUR HELP, THE 2026 ELECTION STARTS NOW! We cannot afford to go into vacation mode. I will transform our administrative offices into an energetic political outreach engine to activate the vast talents we Democrats have, but apparently abandoned in 2024. There is no reason to retain the same leadership that failed us last November. With YOUR help, we can turn this around!!!

Nicholas Mink, State Chair: My name is Nicholas Adrian Mink, and I'm submitting this in order to be considered for chair of the Arizona Democratic Party.

I grew up in the state of Arizona, I wasn't born here, but I've lived here since I was about five or six years old, so I'd like to think I've earned being called a local or a native at this point. I've spent all of my life as a working class man, I started working at 16, and moved around to several different jobs before I found my passion. Since I was a kid, I was always interested in politics, but I think I wrote it off as something that was unrealistic or impossible. That changed after 2016, in the years that followed I watched as an incompetent fool managed to systematically kneecap our nation again and again with no consequences. Over this time, I very slowly started to get politically conscious and activated, which came to a head in 2022.

At that time, I had already begun some labor, organizing with a group known as the IWW, but what really got me started politically was the revocation of Roe v. Wade.

Since then, I've engaged in political organizing and I learned a lot about organizing, but one thing that remain true is that no matter how good of a campaign you run if the messaging and narrative and energy isn't there, you won't be able to energize people to come out and vote.

In 2024 we saw several things play out, we saw a failure of messaging, but outside of that we saw a failure of the narrative that Democrats had tried to put together. Republicans addressed the fact that peoples lives still felt like they were completely unstable, people still felt like they were suffering, even as all of the numbers said that our economy was doing fantastically. And the truth is our economy may be doing fantastically for corporations, but it's not doing fantastic for the every day worker, in fact, it's some of the worst that it's ever been. Wealth inequality in our society is currently worse than it was in France before the French revolution. We have entire cities burning to the ground due to climate change, and the current response to this by the Democratic Party is to capitulate more to the right wing

There is an enormous movement backed by some very powerful people within the Democratic Party to move us further to the right, to turn our party into the Kyrsten Sinema party. I instead would like to see our party return to a party of working people, that addresses people's everyday problems, without abandoning our values and the people that rely on us for their safety, security, and livelihoods. That's why I'm running to be chair of the Arizona Democratic Party, to refocus our party on our values and to bring our focus back to the working people.

First Vice-Chair Candidates:

Paul Eckerstrom, First Vice-Chair/Senior Vice-Chair: Paul Eckerstrom is running for reelection as 1st Vice Chair of the Arizona Democratic Party. Eckerstrom has been the ADP's 1st Vice Chair for the past two years and is a long-time Democratic activist from Pima County. He worked on Congressman Mo Udall's campaigns in the early 1980's and later from January 1987 through February 1988, worked as a field organizer for Governor Bruce Babbitt's Presidential Campaign in the Iowa caucuses. He has been a precinct committee person most of his adult life as well as a state committee person most of that time as well. In 2002, he worked as a volunteer on Congressman Raul Grijalva's first congressional campaign and on Janet Napolitano's gubernatorial campaign. While working as a prosecutor in the Arizona Attorney General's Office for both Janet Napolitano and Terry Goodard, Paul became the Pima County Democratic Chair from 2003 to 2006 where he helped build the County Party into the strong, sustainable organization it is today. He was elected to be the Arizona Democratic Party Chair in 2009 but had to resign for reasons of work commitments in his new day job at the time.

Commenting on the 2024 election, Eckerstrom explained, "Although, we did not take Arizona for Harris, we did help Ruben Gallego across the finish line and take an open seat in the Senate, not an insignificant achievement in this difficult election cycle. And with the help of the Arizona Democratic Party, the abortion rights initiative passed and we have now enshrined those rights

into our Constitution.” Eckerstrom went on, “the next step should be a focus on capturing the State Legislature that has not been Democratic hands since 1966,” He believes that we need to run someone even in the reddest districts. With clean election money, he believes these legislative candidates can bring the Democratic message to every corner of the State, even in the reddest of Districts, which in turn helps candidates up-ballot and lays the groundwork to turn those areas blue. He also believes in a grass roots effort by the Democrats to do the unglamorous hard work of Voter Registration in the off year up to the next election cycle. This effort needs to be coupled with a message that Democrats are the party that supports working families against the greed and corruption of the huge corporations and billionaires who are hoarding the wealth of this country. Eckerstrom has said, “persuade and win is my motto.”

I'm Shanna Leonard and I'm running for Senior vice chair

I'm from Pima County and have served two terms as a state vice chair - I'm active in my legislative district and am in my second term as a member of the LD 20 Board. I want to serve as Senior Vice chair for two reasons 1) we need continuity in the board to help support new officers 2) The senior vice chair serves on the rules committee. I want to serve on this body ensure that the State party bylaws increase transparency and communication.

I come from the roots of the grass roots. As an active LD organizer I know we would improve our success if we had more resources and communication across all parts of the democratic party statewide.

I have been an active PC for 8 years in AZ - These are My most recent efforts: Last cycle I led a bilingual postcard voter registration effort that sent ~t 20,000 bilingual postcards created by a local latina artist. I coordinated distribution of these cards both in my LD, and neighboring ones - I also worked closely with the leadership of neighboring swing district LD 16 to help in the Pima County portion of this gerrymandered district, assisting with fundraising, connecting candidates with local volunteers and canvassing. In addition I assisted Deb Howard in LD 27 with data, canvassing and event planning. I also coordinated our LDs first texting campaign - we sent almost 50,000 texts with voter guides, and detailed voting information. We responded to questions and answered hundreds of queries, which helped allow democrats to overcome obstacles to voting.

Previously I worked as a precinct lead, and in 2022 developing a voter information guide for our LD and canvassing as well as coordinating distribution.

My primary interest is integrating the State party activities with the rank and file democratic PC activities to make us more successful.

In 2020, I moved back to AZ. When the pandemic hit, I started taking action, writing to volunteers and neighbors. That led to social events supporting the community and other outreach to voters in my district. I focused my energy on my immediate community, Ahwatukee, and got to know the many wonderful volunteers there. We all worked hard to help put Joe Biden in the White House that year.

In 2021 I joined the board of LD12 Democrats as the First Vice Chair, and soon thereafter became Acting Chair. In 2022, I was elected as the Chair. In November, I was re-elected for a 2nd term as the Chair. In the 2024 election, I helped lead the way to victory in our legislative district. We re-elected our 3 legislators and won seats for school board members at each of the school districts in our LD. After successfully fundraising over 100K dollars in act blue alone, LD12 sent out 35K letters, 10K postcards, 30K mailers, and canvassed every precinct in our district. Our volunteers distributed over 100K blue voter guides, through canvasses, lit drops and by having volunteers staff every Voting Center in our District on Election Day. Our legislative district recruited 110 new PCs giving us a total of 253 PCs (35% increase) and we now have 84 state committee members, the most in the state.

My goal for the upcoming non-election year is to work with all legislative districts to be more collaborative. If we work together as a team, we can make a big impact on our future. I would like to see a model of shared knowledge implemented across LD's in our state where we can learn from each other and employ best practices across districts. Most of all, I am dedicated to continue the fight for democracy and a better future for all.

Outside of politics, I am married with two adult daughters; one is an educator and one is a physician. I have 9 year old twin granddaughters that motivate me to fight for a better future for them. I'm also a co-owner of a local woman owned small business.

Educational Coordinator Candidates

Llama Habern, Educational Coordinator: Llama Habern is a queer, trans, disabled community organizer located in Yavapai County. They have served as Educational Coordinator for the Arizona Democratic Party since January of 2023, and would like the opportunity to continue the work they are doing on making the party platform more accessible to candidates and volunteers.

Before coming to the Verde Valley in 2021, Llama spent 7 years working for a national nonprofit that helped prepare members to run for office and take other public leadership positions in policy, advocacy, and organizing. When Llama moved in time for the 2022 campaign season, they took on the task of leading the Democratic voter contact efforts in Sedona and the Verde Valley. These experiences contributed to Llama's decision to found a nonprofit called Rural Organizing Initiative (ROI), which focuses on supporting nonpartisan candidates running for local seats such as city/town council and school board.

Living in a rural red area, Llama is more than aware that Democratic voters often have few or no choices on their ballots. When the only people running for office are Republicans, it is easy for Democratic voters in these areas to feel like they have no one to vote for and that their vote

doesn't matter. That is why Llama believes it is essential to run candidates in as many races as possible. No seat should go uncontested.

They put this idea into practice in 2024 when their nonprofit recruited and supported 13 candidates for local offices in the Verde Valley. The result was an average 6% increase in voter turnout in the targeted races, and the overall win rate of their supported candidates was 46%. They are particularly proud of their victory with the Cottonwood City Council. What was a MAGA majority last year is now wholly progressive, and having options on the ballot led to a 12% voter turnout increase in the council race specifically.

The main responsibility of the Educational Coordinator is to chair the platform committee, and the platform is more than just a summary of our stances on issues. It is a statement of our values as Democrats. Llama believes that a core piece of that must be a dedication to running candidates in every possible race, whether it is considered competitive or not.
